FROM THE PASTOR

1 July 2018

A warm welcome to **Father Justin Miller** as he begins his priestly ministry as a parochial vicar at Saint Mary's Church and Saints Mary & Martha Parish. Ordained a priest in 2015, Father Miller has served for two years as a parochial vicar at St. Joseph Church and Holy Spirit Church in Penfield, New York. Prior to that, he had served for a year as a deacon at Our Lady of Peace Parish in Geneva to which parish Father Erick has gone.

On June 5, **Father Joseph Osei Bonsu** should be arriving for a two month stay in Auburn. On August 18/19, Father Joseph will be the "visiting missionary" at Saints Mary & Martha Parish on behalf of the annual Missionary Cooperative Plan. On two other weekends, he will be the "visiting missionary" at St. Mary's Church on July 28/29 and at Holy Family Church on August 25/26.

Deacon Dennis Donahue has renewed his three-year contract with St. Mary's Church. In addition, he also will be the parish deacon for Saints Mary & Martha Parish. At both parishes, he will be the coordinator for the new evangelization and also will be available for individual counseling. You will hear more about that from Deacon Dennis himself.

Deacon Matthew Walter continues to be with us for his pastoral assignment during the summer. We are so fortunate to have such fine priests and deacons in our parish.

PASTORAL PLANNING UPDATE:

Shared Business Office Begins This Week

Some significant changes are underway in response to Bishop Matano's request a year ago that we consider seriously the re-alignment of staffing and ministries, including a shared finance/business office.

- The Regional Finance Director, in a meeting with the pastors in January, determined a shared business office begin on July 1, 2018. Shawn Gillen-Caryl, regional finance director, has since met with the pastors to share with them how logistics and implementation would be worked out.
- Why? To allow staff to specialize but also have back up for time away, to reduce duplication, and to benefit from economies of scale so that we use parish financial resources most responsibly.
- After a hiring process, the following accepted the new positions: Star Yankton and Kim Guinnip (full-time business managers), Sandi Mettler and Jerome Brabant (part-time bookkeepers). Before the hiring process began, Patricia Tamburrino decided to retire on 6/30 after a long, productive time serving Ss. Mary and Martha Parish, and Susan Talamo resigned effective the same date. We wish them both well in their future endeavors and thank God for their dedicated service.
- Forty-two of our collection counters gathered on 6/7 to learn more and ask questions. More counters are always needed! If you are interested in joining one of your parish's counting teams, please contact Shawn Gillen-Caryl @ 252-7261.

This move to a shared business office is the first visible change coming from the ongoing planning effort. (There had already been agreement on creating two clusters and a weekend Mass schedule for whenever any of our priests move to senior priest status or different appointments, but these changes remain in the future.)

Please pray for the wellbeing of all those impacted by this change and continue to pray for our six parishes.

ST. PEREGRINE PRAYER SERVICE will take place on this coming **Tuesday, July 3** at 5:30 pm at St. Francis of Assisi Church. Peregrine is the patron saint of all who are afflicted with cancer, leg ailments or any life-threatening or chronic illness. He is popularly known as "The Cancer Saint." The Service consists of prayers for those who are afflicted with cancer or any other serious illness; each individual may receive a blessing with the relic of St. Peregrine.



A FAMILY OF FAITH: There are many ways in which we can compare the request for healing made by Jairus and the request of the woman with the hemorrhage. One comparison helps us think about prayer. Jairus asked Jesus for healing on his daughter's behalf; the woman with the hemorrhage had no one to speak for her and bravely approached Jesus on her own initiative. In our prayers, we do both. We intercede for others' needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. We find hope in Jesus' response to both of these people, who sought him out in their hour of need.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things you have prayed for this week. Notice that some of your prayers may have been for other people, and some of your prayers may have been for your own needs. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 5:21-43. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for the needs of others and for our own needs with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God, who hears our needs and answers them, by praying today's psalm, Psalm 30.

LITURGICAL THEMES & FEASTS: Blame it on the heat. Time takes it easy in July. So does our liturgical calendar. We do honor 21 saints, among them Kateri Tekakwitha (14), a significant Native American presence among our holy ones. The roster of American saints expands as the last three popes have added many names to our list of up-and-coming role models. So we acknowledge two recently beatified citizens, Puerto Rican lay catechist Charlie Rodríguez Santiago (13) and Stanley Rother, Oklahoma diocesan priest and missionary, martyred in Guatemala (28). They remind us that holy living is not only possible, but expected of all of us.

The nation celebrates Independence Day (4), National Parents' Day (21), and World Friendship Day (30). The latter, begun as a Hallmark Card gimmick in the 1920s, has since been embraced by a global community hopeful of a closer-knit world. Jews observe a day of mourning on Tish'a B'av (21), recalling the Temple's destruction. As we live these very ordinary days, five prophets (Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, Micah, and Jeremiah) urge us forward in the daily lectionary.
