FROM THE PASTOR

8 July 2018

The readings this week and next week call our attention to the role of the prophet. Prophecy is still commonly misunderstood. People think of it as foretelling the future through some kind of miraculous gift of knowledge from God.

Prophets do sometimes tell us what the future will bring but it is usually a matter of looking at what is going on in the present and seeing the likely consequences. Think, for example, of all the scientists who have been warning us for several decades that our continued use of fossil fuels was going to wreak destruction on our world. They might not have called themselves prophets, but they could see the future on the basis of what was already happening to the carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere.

As today's readings remind us, the message of the prophet is often rejected. When God calls Ezekiel to the ministry of prophecy, God warns him, "And whether they heed or resist – for they are a rebellious house – they shall know that a prophet has been among them." In today's Gospel, Jesus acknowledges the resistance, too: "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

The challenge for all of us who claim to seek God's will and follow Christ is to respond to the prophets with receptivity and a willingness to rethink our attitudes and behaviors. It is always hard, because few if any human beings welcome change, especially when the need for change is pointed out by someone else.

How open is each of us to God's word, however it comes to our attention?

FROM THE FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR

A Family of Faith: Our family plays an important role in shaping us and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. But sometimes the influences from outside our family can make us unrecognizable to those who know us best. These outside influences can lead us away from God, or they can lead us toward a deeper relationship with God. In today's Gospel, we see that the people of Nazareth could not recognize Jesus as the Son of God. They could know him only as the son of Mary. We hope that through our family life we will be encouraged to filter the many influences on our lives through the lens of faith so that we will become the person that God calls us to be. As you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Acknowledge that many of these people and events are positive influences, helping us be better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. Also acknowledge, however, that there are negative influences in our lives that risk pulling us away from God. Observe that Jesus was a person who allowed his relationship with God to be the most important thing in his life. This led many people to have faith in him as the Son of God. However, not everyone could recognize this about Jesus.

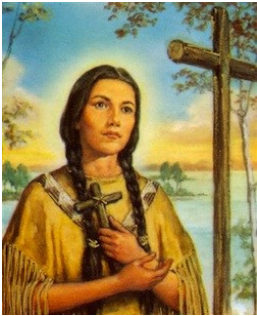

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha



Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, affectionately called the 'Lily of the Mohawks', was born in New York in 1656 to a Mohawk chief father and an Algonquin mother.

When Kateri was just four years old a smallpox epidemic swept through her village, killing her entire family. In addition to leaving her orphaned, the disease left her partially blind, disfigured, and crippled.

At the age of twenty, Kateri was baptized by the Jesuits with the name Catherine (which translates "Kateri") after St. Catherine of Siena. Due to the hostility between the Indian tribes and the missionaries, Kateri was ostracized from her village after becoming Catholic. She fled for refuge to a French Jesuit mission in Montreal, Canada. Once safe at the mission, she realized her desire to live a simple life of prayer and penance.

Kateri Tekakwitha died of an illness in 1680, during Holy Week, when she was just twenty-four years old.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II in 1980 and canonized in October 2012 by Pope Benedict XVI during the opening ceremonies for the Year of Faith. Her feast day is July 14 and she is the patron saint of the environment, ecology, and orphans.
