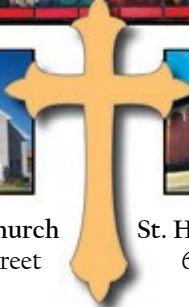

## FROM THE PASTOR

11 June 2017

Fifty years ago on June 3, 1967, I was ordained a priest. My first Mass was celebrated fifty years ago on the Feast of the Holy Trinity, so I am pleased to be able to observe my anniversary with the Celebration of Evening Prayer (Vespers) today on this feast of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

The ministry of a priest, like any helping profession, is not easy to quantify and the effects are difficult to measure. Perhaps it is not our place to quantify or measure them. In his Letter to the Ephesians, which will be read at Vespers, St. Paul says: "I urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love." I hope I am at least moving in that direction, but God, of course, is the final Judge.

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. When we proclaim the three persons in prayer, we do not make a circular or triangular gesture that would visually connote the Trinity's eternal existence or equality of Persons. Rather, the specific sign by which we have come to know the nature of our Triune God is the sign of the self-sacrificing love of the second Person of the Trinity, Jesus, who took our human flesh so that we might be reborn to new life in the name of the Holy Trinity.

So, in pronouncing the names of all three Persons, we trace over ourselves only the sign of Jesus' cross, hoping that by often speaking those three names while making that one sign, our lives will be shaped, day by day, year after year, to a truer image and likeness of God's own love.

**HARD-HITTING MESSAGE:** You may remember back in the late 1970s and early 1980s, people would sometimes hold up signs that read “John 3:16” at football games. More recently, when outspoken Christian quarterback Tim Tebow played for the Florida Gators, he wrote “John 3:16” on his eye black in a championship game. Later in a freaky coincidence (although some interpret it as divine intervention) Tebow, playing for the Denver Broncos, threw an 80-yard touchdown pass for a miracle win—and the completion gave him 316 passing yards for the game, with his total completions averaging 31.6 yards each.

I was a kid the first time I saw the verse at a game, and curious about what I assumed was its connection to sports, I looked it up: “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.” I didn’t understand it then, but now I realize that verse is the perfect sound bite for Christianity—sums it all up in one sentence—perfect for getting through to large, loud, unruly crowds.

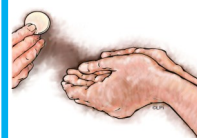
