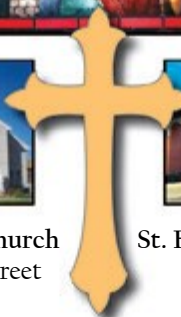

## FROM THE PASTOR

12 May 2019

In our first reading today, St. Paul and Barnabas encounter opposition and “violent abuse” because they were preaching to Gentiles and inviting them to seek salvation through Christ. It got so bad that the two of them were expelled from the city.

Those opponents wouldn’t have liked our second reading either. St. John sees a vision of “a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race people, and tongue.” The idea that all nations can be saved was anathema to those Jews, who thought God belonged to them and only they belonged to God.

The universal nature of God’s love and the teaching of Jesus that we are to love as God loves, even loving our enemies, have always provoked opposition. We human beings seem to have an innate tendency to separate into groups and to favor our group over everyone else. We assume that God is on our side, so God must be against those other groups.

We certainly see the tendency today, not only in our own country, but all around the world. We live in a rapidly changing world, and we have not learned how to cope with rapid change. That leads to fear and fear leads to hatred. We see that in our own political scene, and we can see it around the world as leaders stir up fear and hatred of “the other,” whether that means another race, another culture, another religion or people with another viewpoint.

Fear and hatred cannot be the principles on which Christians live and act. The mission of the church is to proclaim God’s love for all people and to foster reconciliation and healing in our world. Christ came to reconcile us to the Father and to one another, and St. Paul reminds us that Christ entrusted that ministry of reconciliation to us.

## FROM FAITH FORMATION DIRECTOR:

Not only can we recognize family members' voices, we can also read the tone of their voices and know something about how they are feeling. In our relationship with Jesus, we know Jesus' voice and are called to follow. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one—not just close, but actually one. Knowing Jesus means knowing the Father. Read with your family today's Gospel, John 10:27-30. Ask your family members to talk about some ways that Jesus brings them closer to God and closer to one another. Pray together an Act of Faith!

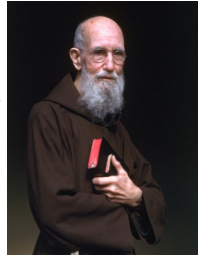

## DEACON'S CORNER:

"I am the Immaculate Conception" was Our Blessed Lady's answer to St Bernadette at Lourdes in 1858. This self identification would receive no greater study then that given by St Maximilian Kolbe in the first half of the 20th Century. He would show the uniqueness of this title only attributable to Mary so there would be no misunderstanding that she was a god. Rather Kolbe's life long study finds that she is the most perfect creation of God with a ongoing role in God's redemptive plan. The significance of Mary's one and only title is further shown by her introduction of it in the words "I am". The same words spoken by God to identify himself to Moses and by Jesus to identify himself to us in the Gospels. Next week we will begin to explore how Kolbe thinks we are to apply this understanding in our lives. ~Deacon Dennis
