FROM THE PASTOR

3 November 2019

The month of November traditionally is the time when Catholics pray for all the Faithful Departed. Praying for the dead is an ancient tradition. In the catacombs of the first three centuries, there is graffiti where Christians during the persecutions recorded prayers for the dead. Saint Monica, mother of Saint Augustine, asked her son, in the fourth century, to remember her soul in his Masses. Such prayers would have been offered only if the early Christians believed in purgatory, even if they did not use that name for it. These prayers would make no sense if those praying thought the deceased would not benefit from prayers. Prayers are not needed by those in the full glory of heaven, and no one can help those in hell.

Some folks are fond of saying the Catholic Church “invented” the doctrine of purgatory because the word “Purgatory” is nowhere found in the Bible. It is true that the word is not found in the Bible, but it does not disprove the existence of purgatory or the fact that belief in it has always been part of Church teaching. The words “Trinity” and “Incarnation” are not in Scripture either, yet those doctrines are clearly taught in the Bible.

There is approval of prayers for the dead in the Second Book of Maccabees. We see how Judas Maccabees went to collect his slain countrymen who had fallen in battle and then took up a collection to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. “In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, in as much as he had the resurrection of the dead in view; for if he were not expecting the fallen to rise again, it would have been useless and foolish to pray for them in death” (2 Maccabees 12:43-44).

In our own day, when a loved one dies, Catholics still request a Mass for the deceased, that is, a Mass prayed for the benefit of someone in purgatory. Our prayers then are for those who die in God’s grace and are assured of their eternal salvation, but are still in need of purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven (cf Revelation 21:27)

FAITH IN THE FAMILY

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus as a guest in the house of Zacchaeus. Talk about the various ways in which your family prepares when guests are expected in your home. Zacchaeus had not prepared to be Jesus' host that day. He was curious about who this Jesus person was. His curiosity led to an encounter with the Lord and a conversion of heart. Because of that encounter he welcomed Jesus better than anyone else due to his change of heart. Discuss how your family might receive Jesus in your home and how you receive Jesus in the guests that you make welcome in your home. Pray together that your family will welcome guests into your home as you would welcome Jesus.

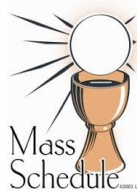

DEACON'S CORNER:

My initial interest in the diaconate came in the mid 1990's. My direct call from God came in late 2000 but my formal inquiry did not start until early 2004. Needless to say I was dragging my feet in making a lifelong commitment to this ministry. In 2005, after a long vetting process, I was accepted into the four year formation program leading up to my ordination in 2009. As a married man, I needed formal written approval of Cindy to enter formation and each year thereafter to continue on. Prior to accepting ordination we had to go on a 5 day canonical retreat together with all potential ordinands and their spouses. Cindy had to give her final signoff before the Bishop's approval could be given. Even after ordination, any diaconal assignment given to me by the Bishop must first be approved by Cindy. So it is fair to say that behind any good deacon there is a better deacon's wife.
